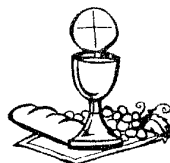

THANKSGIVING OFFERING

POPE EXPRESSES SOLIDARITY AND SADNESS FOR VICTIMS OF JAPAN

FLOODS Pope Francis expressed his 'heartfelt solidarity' with all those affected by the worst flood disaster to strike western Japan in 35 years and said he is praying 'especially for the repose of the deceased, the healing of those injured and the consolation of all those who grieve'. Officials said that at least 119 people have been killed and dozens are still missing after torrential rain unleashed floods and landslides that have forced several million from their homes. The Pope also offered 'encouragement to the civil authorities and all those involved in the search and rescue efforts as they assist the victims of this disaster' and upon all he invoked 'abundant blessings'.



THAI FOOTBALL TEAM FREED FROM CAVE

Twelve Thai boys and their assistant soccer coach have been the focus of the world's attention since they first went missing 18 days ago. The boys, aged between 11 and 16, and their 25-year-old coach had been exploring a cave in Thailand after soccer practice when they became trapped inside by monsoon flooding. It took a mammoth international rescue effort to finally free them, with the boys having to swim and dive through tight and dark passages. During this difficult time, the world was united in prayers. Pope Francis offered prayers for the boys and their coach. Thank God for the joyful outcome.

Feast Day of the Week: Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Monday 11th July

Sacred Scripture celebrated the beauty of Carmel where the prophet Elijah defended the purity of Israel's faith in the living God. In the twelfth century, hermits withdrew to that mountain and later founded the Carmelite order devoted to the contemplative life under the patronage of Mary, the holy Mother of God. Devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel is worldwide, and most Catholics are familiar with the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, also known as the Brown Scapular. Mary appeared to St. Simon Stock on July 16, 1251, and gave him the scapular with the following words, which are preserved in a fourteenth century narrative: "This will be for you and for all Carmelites the privilege, that he who dies in this will not suffer eternal fire." The feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel was instituted for the Carmelites in 1332, and extended to the whole Church by Benedict XIII in 1726.
