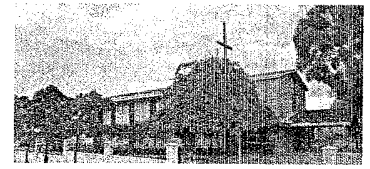

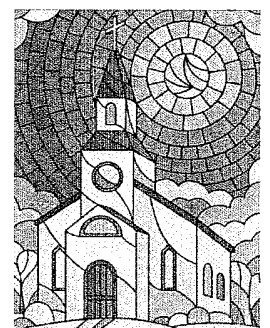

Watching the Holy Father's Travels

The Holy Father, Pope Francis, has been committed to travelling to the churches at the fringes, to support the faithful there (often a small minority in those nations), to build bridges with other religions including Eastern Orthodox and Muslims. Already he has completed four trips this year, to Panama City (for World Youth Day celebrations), to Abu Dhabi in the United Arab Emirates (formal statement of Christian/Muslim fraternity with the the imam, chair of the Muslim Council of Elders), to Morocco (to inspire more Muslim/Christian dialogue) and to Bulgaria with North Macedonia. Each visit has been a diplomatic tightrope walk, and so far each has been very well received by all parties with an interest in improving global relations. At the end of the month, Pope Francis travels to Romania at a time when the Eastern Orthodox churches (for there are many) are striving for pre-eminence and at very real risk of schisms. Pray for continued good health and energy for our Pope as he patiently and delicately brings the Holy Spirit to lands with so many problems.

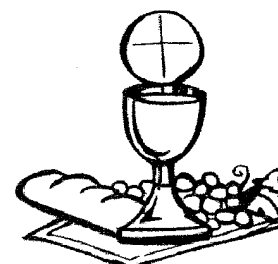
