## Happy and Blessed Easter

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Risen Christ

Over the last few weeks, the world has become a lonelier and more insecure place. The freedom and joy of gathering with our loved ones has been reduced to a minimum. Our television screens are filled with disturbing news about the thousands around the world who have succumbed to the coronavirus. What is worse, at a time when the sacred celebration of rites of our christian faith should be a comfort to us, we are not able to pray together in our parish church.

In this time of isolation and fear, the message of Easter is hope. On the Easter Sunday morning, as the Gospel of John relates, the world seemed a dark place for Mary Magdalene, Simon Peter and the beloved disciple, but they gradually woke up to a new vision of life. They saw the tomb, empty. They observed the cloths that had wrapped the body of Jesus, and then they encountered the Risen Lord. From the darkness of unknowing and confusion, God brought light. Into the emptiness, God gave life. Instead of sorrow, God made their joy overflow. It was through the ordinariness of their own life experience, the Risen One was present to them.

**Weekly Collections**: By Gerald Stack, Chair of the Parish Finance Committee.

I wish to draw your attention to a side effect of the ban on parish gatherings, namely the absence of the weekly collections and income for the ongoing expenses of the parish as well as the continuing need to support our priests. The restriction on masses may persist for six or nine months. Prudence indicates that we should make arrangements to continue weekly contributions where we can, as a large catch-up when we can come together again would be a great imposition.

One method would be by scheduled **Direct Debits**, and the forms for this can be sent out if you contact Father or the Parish Office. Another method is **Electronic Funds Transfer** (EFT) direct to the parish bank account, and the details are, BSB: 086 006, Account: 6919 06978, Account Name: St Aloysius Parish, Reference: Your family name, Initial. Please indicate what the transfer is for  $-1^{st}$  or  $2^{nd}$  collection; Mass Offering; etc. - by adding to the Reference with a suffix, such as StackG1st or StackG2nd. Do not mail cash, only mail **cheques**. For **cash**, keep in envelopes marked with the date, your name (optional) and what it is intended for (1<sup>st</sup> or  $2^{nd}$  collection). There will be collection day where you can drop the envelopes at the church, say 9.30am on the first Sunday of the month. This will be confirmed next week. # First reading Acts 10:34,37-43

#### 'We have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection'

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

### Gospel John 20:1-9

#### He must rise from the dead

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.' So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
